

# Adult Autism Advanced

This 2-day live webinar will focus on providing practical tools for assessing and understanding how autism presents in **adults**. Topics covered will include:

- Best practice tools and processes for screening and diagnostic assessment of autism in adults
- Common co-occurring mental health and neurodevelopmental differences in autistic adults
- Video case example of an adult autism assessment, including formulation
- Neuroaffirming feedback processes and recommendations for post diagnostic support
- Lived and living experience perspectives.
